1.0 Location and time

Representatives of four WBC universities (UKG, UNS, UM and UZ) visited Hamburg University of Technology (TUHH) in the period from 3rd until 6th April 2013.

2.0 Purpose

The purpose of this visit was to learn about German experiences in knowledge transfer, transforming research into innovation and growing regional business in the area of Hamburg City. The mobility is planned in order to enhance the understanding of good practices through visits to Technical University of Hamburg, TuTech and other units.

3.0 Outcome

Each representative of WBC universities were able to learn about the knowledge transfer though on-site visits. There, examples of university-enterprise linkages were shown and explained so that the WBC partners were able to gather information and compare good practices with their own experiences. Later on, for the WBC partners important insights can be extracted in order to contribute to the overall target of modernizing the WBC universities through the strengthening of their management structures / services for cooperation with the world of business in the areas of knowledge transfer, research and innovation.

4.0 Programme for study visit

The first day of visit included: Part I – Opening and welcome session, Part II – Field Visit to TuTech, a on site visit of the Knowledge Transfer Service Provider of Hamburg University of Technology, and Part II – Field Visit to HLI, a successful example of a Public Private Partnership.

The second day included two workshop sessions: Part IV – Institute of Business Logistics and General Management, Successful Knowledge Transfer and Part V, Knowledge Transfer from an industry point of view. Those two parts are dedicated to the intensive discussion on the knowledge transfer for universities and enterprises.


